Dear Parents/Carers,

Meet the Headteacher

Another highlight for me has been meeting the parents and carers of some of our pupils. It was lovely to see so many of you at the 'Meet the Head teacher' sessions on Wednesday 20th September. I hope you valued the opportunity to find out a little more about me and the type of school I would like Wordsley to be, as much as I appreciated your feedback, thoughts and questions. We are a school that serves our community and developing positive working relationships with our families is incredibly important. Ultimately, we want the same thing, namely for your child to be happy and successful. As requested on the evening, I will be arranging future sessions where you will be given the opportunity to have an input into the school. Code of Conduct

I would like to ask that you take the time to discuss the school code of conduct with your child (link). Along with our school values, this is one of the foundations of our school and outlines our expectations for all children who attend Wordsley. It is vitally important that pupils are clear on our expectations so that they are able to make the right choices and behave in a way that enables staff to teach, and other pupils to learn. I discussed this with pupils in assembly time last week to ensure that pupils are clear on what we expect from them with regard to standard of uniform and equipment, as well as behaviour in lessons and at social times. I will also highlight to pupils the importance of embodying our school values, especially kindness and respect which I hold in such high regard.

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Class Charts

In order for you as parents to be more informed on how your child is behaving in school, we at Wordsley have invested in Class Charts. This will give you up to date information on any positives and negatives your child has received, as well as informing you of any upcoming detentions. Homework will also be set on Class Charts from now on, whereas Years 8-11 will continue to use Satchel One up until Christmas, when Sims and Satchel One will be phased out. Class Charts is a widely used and well received package. I hope you find it useful.

In order for parents/carers to see how Year 7 students have settled in, there will be a parents' evening on Wednesday 11th October 3.30pm to 5.30pm. This will provide an opportunity to meet your child's form teacher and ask questions about their early weeks at the school. I hope to see as many of your there as possible.
